Will the Minister of **FISHERIES, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRYING**

- (a) the details of the schemes being implemented in Madhya Pradesh;
- (b) the names of the schemes which have benefitted the cattle business in Bhind and Datia districts; and
- (c) the details of funds allocated, released and utilized for the said districts under the said schemes, year and district-wise?

**ANSWER**

(a) The Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying has been implementing several schemes nationwide, including in Madhya Pradesh:

(i) **Rashtriya Gokul Mission:** This scheme aims to develop and conserve indigenous bovine breeds, genetically upgrade the bovine population, and boost milk production and productivity.

(ii) **National Programme for Dairy Development:** The focus of this scheme is on establishing dairy infrastructure for milk procurement, processing, and marketing within the cooperative dairy sector.

(iii) **National Livestock Mission (NLM):** NLM seeks to generate employment, foster entrepreneurship, enhance per-animal productivity, and increase production of meat, goat milk, eggs, and wool.

(iv) **Livestock Health and Disease Control Programme:** This scheme provides support for controlling livestock diseases such as Foot and Mouth Disease and Brucellosis, as well as other infectious diseases in dairy animals. It also includes the deployment of Mobile Veterinary Units to deliver livestock health services directly to farmers.

(v) **Animal Husbandry Infrastructure Development Fund (AHIDF):** This scheme promotes investments in areas such as dairy processing, meat processing, animal feed plants, breed improvement technology, veterinary vaccine and drug production facilities, and management of animal waste for wealth generation. With the success of AHIDF, the Dairy Processing Infrastructure Development Fund was merged into AHIDF on February 1, 2024, bringing the fund's total size to ₹29,110 crore.

(vi) **Kisan Credit Card (KCC):** The Government has extended the KCC scheme to Animal Husbandry and Fisheries farmers to meet their working capital needs. This facility is

accessible to individual or joint borrowers, Joint Liability Groups, and Self-Help Groups, including tenant farmers with owned, rented, or leased sheds.

(b) The following schemes have significantly benefitted the cattle business in Madhya Pradesh, including Bhind and Datia districts:

(i) **Rashtriya Gokul Mission:** Under the Nationwide Artificial Insemination (AI) Programme of this mission, Bhind district saw 1.89 lakh animals covered, 2.1 lakh AI procedures conducted, and 1.23 lakh farmers benefited. Similarly, Datia district had 0.96 lakh animals covered, 1.14 lakh AI performed and 0.62 lakh farmers benefited.

(ii) **National Programme for Dairy Development:** Bhind and Datia districts were included under this scheme, with a project approved in 2018-19 at a cost of ₹218.5 lakh. Additionally, 27 Automatic Milk Collection Units with Milk Analyzers were established in these districts at a total expenditure of ₹36.45 lakh.

(iii) **Livestock Health and Disease Control Programme:** This scheme facilitated 10.12 lakh Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD) vaccinations in Bhind district and 6.97 lakh FMD vaccinations in Datia district.

(iv) **Kisan Credit Card (KCC):** Across Madhya Pradesh, a total of 2.20 lakh operative Kisan Credit Cards are currently in use.

(c) Details regarding funds allocated and released under these schemes to Madhya Pradesh, including Datia and Bhind districts, over the past three years and the current financial year are provided in Annexure-I
