FAKE DAIRY PRODUCTS

3588 SHRI PARIMAL NATHWANI:

WILL THE MINISTER OF FISHERIES, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRYING be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government is aware about the fake dairy products being sold in the market;
- (b) if so, the details of the fake dairy products seized in the last three years, State-wise;
- (c) details of increase in the number of milching animals in the last three years, State-wise; and
- (d) details of increase in the dairy products in the last three years, State-wise?

ANSWER

**THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR FISHERIES, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRYING

- (a) & (b) The Government of India enacted Food Safety and Standards (FSS) Act- 2006 to unify food related laws and establish the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI). The FSSAI sets science-based standards for food articles and regulates their manufacture, storage, distribution, sale and import to ensure availability of safe and wholesome food for human consumption. The implementation and enforcement of FSS Act are carried out by FSSAI through Food Safety Commissioners of State Governments and Union Territory Administrations. FSSAI has notified Standards for various dairy products and analogues under FSS (Food product standards & Food Additives) Regulations, 2011. The dairy products have been classified under High-Risk Food Categories. According to FSSAI, regular surveillance, monitoring, inspection and random sampling are conducted throughout the year. In a surveillance drive conducted during 2023, more than 10,000 samples of milk & milk products were tested. The result of this survey revealed that 98% samples were safe for human consumption. Information about state-wise fake dairy products seized is not available. As informed by FSSAI, the details of action taken in last three years against the defaulting Food Business Operators for non-compliance in Milk & Milk Products are given as under:
