Operational Guidelines for Part- VIII (Livestock Sector Reforms) of the Scheme for Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment FY 2026-27 (SASCI 2026-27)

1. **Objective:** The objective of the Part - VIII (Livestock Sector Reforms) of the scheme guidelines for 'Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment 2026-27 (SASCI 2026-27)' issued by Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance, Government of India vide their letter No.44(1)/PF-S/2026-27 (CAPEX) dated 27th March, 2026 is to facilitate the development of a robust ecosystem for the livestock sector and to promote the creation of quality infrastructure in livestock, dairy and veterinary sector.
2. **Outlay:** An amount of **₹3,000 crore** is earmarked under this Part of the scheme for FY2026-27. The incentive amounts may be utilized by the State Government/UT Administrations for capital projects in any sector. However, preference may be given to utilize this amount to strengthen the livestock & veterinary infrastructure listed in **Annexure I**.
3. **Grouping of States:** For providing incentive under SASCI Part – VIII (Livestock Sector Reforms), States/UTs have been grouped as follows:

4. **Reforms and Incentive Structure:** Release of incentives under this Part, States/UTs shall be subject to the fulfilment of the qualifying criteria and the score obtained under the performance criteria, as specified below –

For qualifying of incentives under this Part, States/UTs shall fulfil at least five out of the following six criteria as on 30.09.2026 -

6. States/ Union Territories will earmark preferably minimum of 20 percent of their allocated funds for underserved areas of States/UTs. The State wise list of underserved districts are attached as **Annexures –IX**, which is consist of PM-DDKY districts as per the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Aspirational Districts as per NITI Aayog, Hilly Districts as per the India State of Forest Report 2023, North-Eastern Districts as per official districts within each state, and Arid regions as per the National Rainfed Area Authority. Further **Annexure – X** is the underserved Blocks as per NITI Aayog's Aspirational Blocks Programme which are not covered in Aspirational Districts listed in Annexure IX.

7. The Special Assistance under SASCI 2026-27 is purely for capital investment. No component for expenditure of recurring nature is admissible under this. The States & UTs with legislature shall ensure that there is no duplication in funding of the projects approved under the scheme with either funds provided by the Government of India or any funds of States/ UTs. Further, the State/UT Governments shall ensure that there is no duplication in the projects submitted for approval under different parts of the Scheme for SASCI. States/ UTs, if they wish, may submit projects of a higher value than the funds allocated, indicating their preference/ priority. The balance amount of such projects, over and above of the fund allocated to be borne by the States/UTs from their own resources.

8. **Submission and Verification:**

State Governments/ UT Administrations, upon completion of the reforms, shall submit a report alongwith documentary evidence to the Advisor (Stats) (e-mail: advisor.ahs@dahd.nic.in) Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying (DAHD), Government of India in the prescribed format at **Annexure XI to Annexure XIII** latest by **30.11.2026**. DAHD will examine the reports submitted by States/UTs through an internal Committee, to be constituted for the purpose. The DAHD shall thereafter make recommendations to the Department of Expenditure (DoE) for release of the incentives amount by **31.12.2026**. The funds/incentives shall be utilized within the financial year 2026-27.

Preferable Items for Capital Expenditure – Livestock & Veterinary

The States/ UTs is free to propose any capital investment project preferably from the list given below from the incentive amount. It may be a fresh as well as last mile feeder for any ongoing project preferably aligned with the capex categories outlined in following table.
